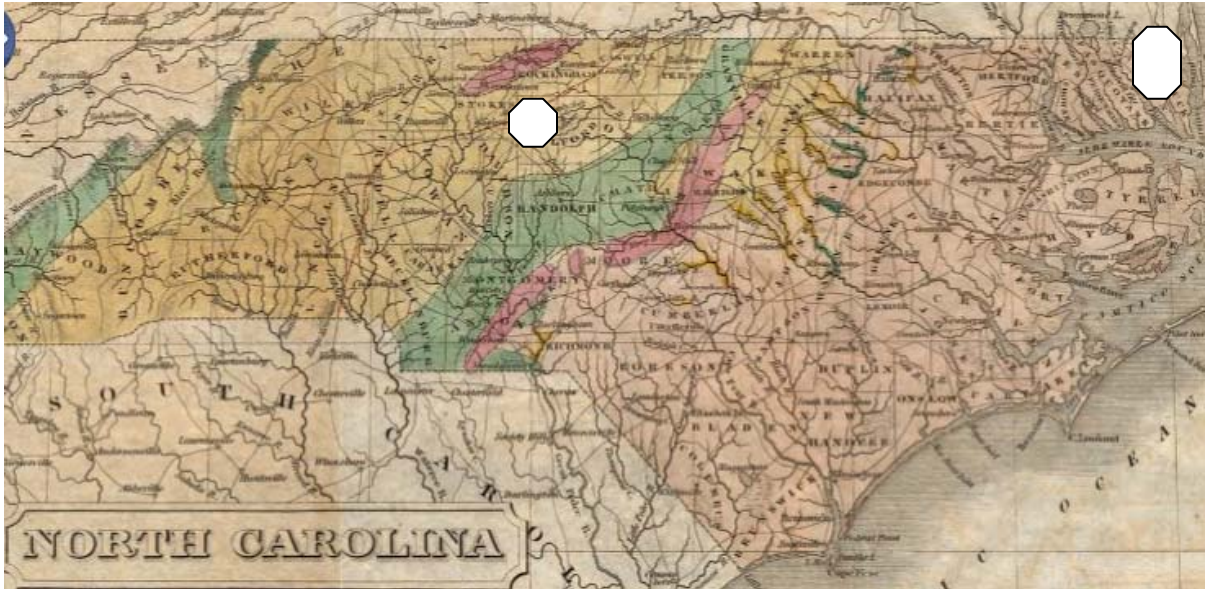


Tracing Abolitionist Movements in North Carolina PowerPoint Answer Sheet
